Mobile and Desktop Versions

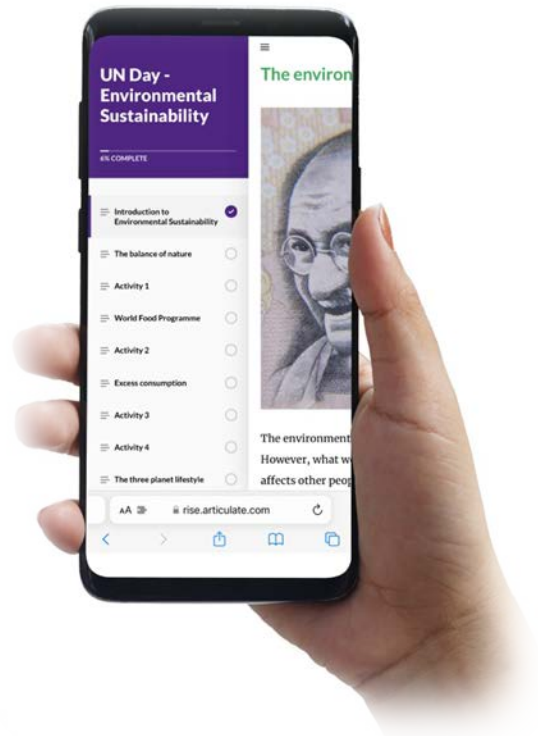

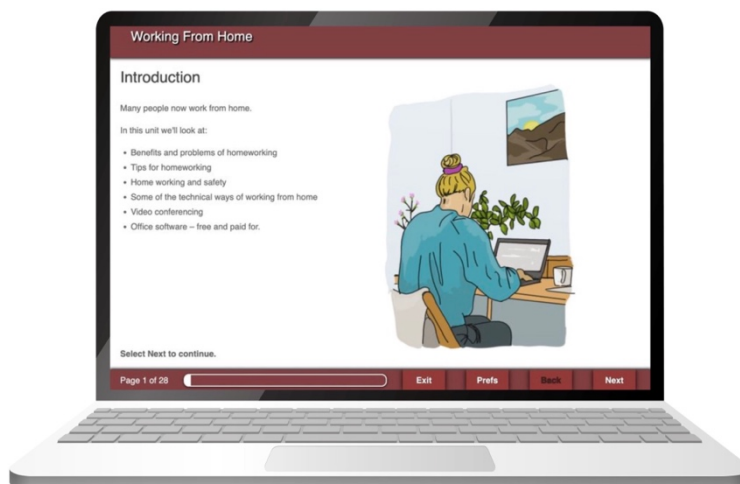

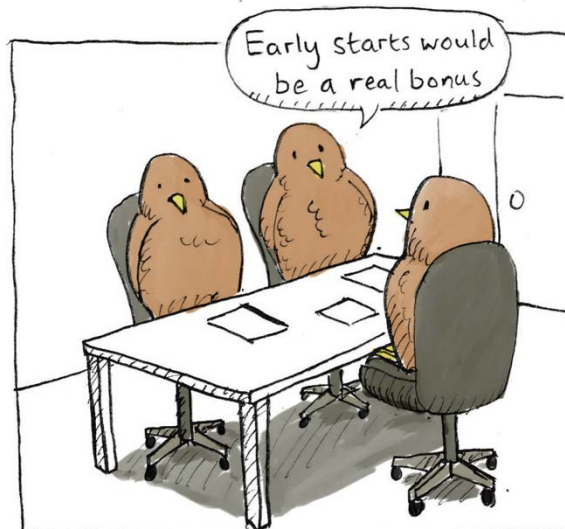

AIM eLearning L1 & L2 Compliance & L1 Environmental Sustainability

AIM compliance qualifications may be delivered entirely via eLearning. eAssessment may take place in college, in the workplace or at home.

L2 Health & Safety In The Workplace is designed to give the learner knowledge and understanding of the basic principles of health and safety, hazards that can arise and some of the protection available against those hazards.

L2 Food Safety in Catering is designed to give the learner knowledge and understanding of the principles of keeping food safe. The course introduces the learner to key issues in Food Safety, taking responsibility for their own food safety and hygiene, keeping work areas clean and keeping food safe.

L1 Health & Safety In A Construction Environment provides the learner with a knowledge and understanding of the principles of health and safety in a construction environment. It covers identifying hazards, reducing risks, fire extinguishers and relevant legislation.

L1 Environmental Sustainability provides knowledge and understanding of the basic principles of sustainability and environmental impacts. The learner is introduced to key issues in sustainability, raising awareness of the topic and encouraging them to consider their role in helping to make sustainable choices.
